- **Luke 2:13-14**
- Greek – **Eirene** (Er-Ray-Nay) ... English – **Peace** ... “Peace ... Tranquility.”
- What I want to do for the rest of this sermon, is remind you of some different encounters that people had with Jesus Christ, and maybe in those encounters you may find the answer to whether or NOT Jesus can bring peace to you.

- d. You Remember King David, right? He committed adultery, and murder a man. There is nothing at all innocent about David ... **AND YET** ... David is referred to as a man after God's Heart. HOW? ... Because only God knows the heart of a person.

- f. **Psalm 32:5**
- g. So ... The first lesson is this: If you have a guilty heart today, Jesus can still be your Prince of Peace. But you have to want Him to be.

- b. Greek – **Legō** ... English – **Thought** ... “To say or speak, with focus on the content ... To be confident about.”

- f. **Mark 5:34**
- g. Do you realize that this is the only place that Jesus calls a woman, ... “Daughter?”
- h. Then He adds ... “Go in Peace”
- i. The second lesson is this: If you have a wounded heart, Jesus can still be your Prince of Peace.
