- First written in 1843 by Placide Cappeau
- Translated into English in 1847 by John Dwight
- Music composed by Adolphe Adam in 1847
- During the Civil War, this song was sung in the North, but no so much in the South. Why? Because of this line "*Chains shall He break, for the slave is our brother.*"
