Introduction:

- Happy Palm Sunday to you and your family!
- Popular thinking "If my good outweighs my bad, then I will make it into Heaven, if there is one."
- The fact is You Cannot Remove Your Guilt.
- Define two words:
 - o <u>REMOVE</u> ... Putting an issue behind you as if it never happened.
 - <u>FORGIVENESS</u> ... When you have truly repented and have asked God to forgive you of what you have admittedly done wrong, only God can offer FORGIVENESS and therefore, truly REMOVE your guilt.
- 1st John 1:9
- Greek <u>Paradidomi</u> (Para-Did-O-Me) ... English <u>Betray</u> ... "To violate a faith or a trust that someone has placed in you."
- Greek <u>Epago</u> (E-Pa-Go) ... English <u>Guilt</u> ... "Deep brokenness because of an act of evil or wrongdoing against God or the innocent."

1. Acts of Betrayal:

- a. Betrayal goes deeper than just wronging someone.
 - i. Robert the Bruce betrays William Wallace.
 - ii. Marcus Brutus betrays Julius Caesar.
- b. Matthew 26:3-4
- c. Matthew 26:14-16 Judas betrays Jesus.
- d. Matthew 26:31-35
- e. **Matthew 26:34** Peter betrays Jesus.
- f. **Matthew 26:74**
- g. Matthew 26:56 ... All the disciples betray Jesus.
- h. We would never want to see ourselves doing what they did. Never!
- i. If you have not responded to the Terms of Pardon, then you are still opposed to Jesus.
- j. Matthew 12:30
- k. **John 14:15**
- 1. Those who have responded to the Terms of Pardon get frustrated when we hear of the disciples betraying Jesus.
- m. But we also betray Jesus for things of little to no value at all.
